It is important to see a pediatric audiologist for further testing at 6 to 9 months of age (see list of phone numbers on back)</p> <p>IF YOUR BABY REFERRED/FAILED: Babies who DID NOT PASS OR REFERRED should be seen right away by a pediatric audiologist for more testing. ECMO
Hyperbilirubinemia requiring exchange transfusion
Family history of permanent childhood hearing loss
Exposure to ototoxic medication

Assisted Ventilation
Neurodegenerative disorders
CMV

Syndromes associated with progressive or late-onset hearing loss
